However, after no success he grows tired of Mary, and begins to look to other women, particularly, Elizabeth. Mary tells Hannah, "'Nobody will ever know how much I have loved him. And now you tell me that he is planning to marry my worst enemy when I am dead. He is looking forward to my death and his life after it" (468). Prince Phillip betrays Mary despite her undying love for him. Gregory uses Mary to further her idea that love can be a bitter emotion, full of hurt, pain, and suffering.
